

Species *Nebelibacter glebicus*

Etymology

[gle.bi'cus] **L. fem. n.** *gleba*, clod or lump of earth; **L. masc. adj. suff.** *-icus*, suffix used with the sense of belonging to; **N.L. masc. adj.** *glebicus*, Pertinent to lumps of earth, referring to a species found in soil

Nomenclatural type

Description

Species established on the basis of ANI comparisons to GTDB R226 and 16S rRNA classifications to Silva 138.2. Based on metabolic reconstruction, *Nebelibacter glebicus* is inferred to encode the rod shape-determining protein MreB and peptidoglycan biosynthesis genes.
