

Species *Rhabdochlamydia crassificans*^{Ts}

Etymology

[cras'si.fi.cans] L. adj. *crassus*, thick; L. suff. *-ficans*, (from L. v. *facio* facere to make) making; N.L. adj. *crassificans*, making thick, referring to the body swelling of cockroaches upon infection

Nomenclatural type

Strain: CRIB-01

Description

Kuo, Stephens (2010): The characteristics are the same as for the genus, except noted. Reticulate bodies are about 0.9 µm in diameter; elementary bodies are about 0.5 µm × 0.25 µm (Corsaro et al., 2007); two intermediate stages have been described resembling the elementary and the reticulate bodies, respectively (Radek, 2000).
